

# TWO KOREAS (ONLINE)

## FREE PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

This 6-week **online course** will help you better understand North Korea and South Korea as two countries with a common past, divided only since 1945, and still stuck in the Cold War many years after the fall of the Soviet bloc. This course is open to teachers who live or work 30 miles away from the University of Southern California.

This program is sponsored by the USC U.S.-China Institute and the National Consortium for Teaching about Asia.



Participants will read 50-60 pages of primary or secondary source materials each week and view the video lectures for that week. We will then have a 1-hour live Zoom video conference on Tuesdays 5:00-6:00 pm PST. Each week, participants are to post thoughts on the readings or video lectures to the discussion forum. You are also expected to watch and review a feature film from Korea and to visit and review a website that includes content on Korea.
